AUGUST PATHS



From the Pastor's Pen

Have you ever heard someone cautioning another person “Don’t put God in a box!”? There is a true & well-intentioned warning to make space for God. Implicit is also the suggestion that we must not limit God’s power & possibility by our own egos, disobedience, & unbelief (Mark 6: 4-6). When I hear someone say “Don’t put God in a box”, “Let go & let God”, or “Let God drive!” whether or not it is being said to me directly, I feel as if the person saying it is missing something important. And perhaps is also “Shoulding on someone” by telling them to be whom they are not or to do something that in human finitude they cannot do. In those moments, I feel stuck. It is at such times that I feel like God is already doing everything, & is already inside lots of boxes. God is after all, inside each one of us! In these moments I wonder & pray: are these perceived anxieties simply your way God, of stirring us into a new thing!?!

In my view, there are 2 main issues with the advice “Don’t put God in a box!” First, I can’t help it. I cannot see, think about, or imagine God in God’s fullness at all. I can only focus on one aspect of God at a time, like an astronomer looking through a telescope at a star in a solar system, in a galaxy, in one universe, in one tiny part God’s infinity. So, in order to think about God in any meaningful way at all, I have to think of God using a series of boxes like for instance, “God is love.” Yet, even in this box, everyday there are many revelations & claims of love. Trying to see what is really love as compared to what some people claim is love is challenge enough. If looking at one aspect of God threatens to melt my brain, remembering simultaneously that God isn’t **just** love but God is also justice, mercy, health, vengeance & salvation- simply seems too much to juggle. I cannot do, or be, more than myself. And, neither can you. So to tell someone “Let go & let God”, “let God drive” or “Don’t put God in a box” is not helpful. It might even be dismissive & hurtful. There is no kindness in asking someone to do something that they- for their own reasons - or reasons of biology- cannot do.

The second problem with the admonition “Don’t put God in a box!” is it is often cover for, “I am not comfortable with what you are saying. But I don’t know scripture very well & don’t study on God very much, so I don’t know what else to say to you, tho’ I don’t want to take the time to find out, even as I don’t want to seem mean & disinterested enough to just ignore you...” This problem is the lazy person’s way of pretending to be pious & be in real relationship, when in reality it is a tip off about lazy theology, lazy listening, & not surprisingly, lazy relationship. “Let God drive”, “Let go & let God”, & “Don’t put God in a box” is not authentic Christian conversation. If I want to discuss the mysteries of evil, atonement, salvation, or election, there is no way to avoid putting God in a box of words, & all of that discussing doesn’t take as much work as real love takes...that is the real reason why we invented platitudes in the first place!
